

“When I met my clients, they were coming from a very contemporary interior and wanted to create a more transitional environment in their new home,” said Judith Lattuca from Judith Designs. They had two specific requirements; 1. They wanted to keep their dining room table, which was lucite and glass, and 2. The color scheme had to be

red, black and white. “I inherited the red carpet in the living room with the project and took off from there.”

The living room was large enough for Judith to create two seating areas; one for conversation and TV viewing, and one for a game table and comfortable seating which faced the patio and golf course beyond. This was done by creating two seating areas which were separated by a custom designed

sofa table, creating a multi-functional area for entertaining large or small groups of people.

Traditional and classic details were used in custom cabinetry and moulding applications to create the mix that they were looking to achieve. “My design challenge for this project was to take a color scheme that can be stark and problematic, and create a warm and inviting space for my clients. We were all pleased with the results.”
